Discover the Power and Grit behind Amateur Para-Swimming through the lens of amateur national goldmedallist, Sofia Brizio. Uncover how the sport can Transform a life, the nuances of disability discrimination in Italy, and a compelling love of the water.







In Nationals Competing for Italy since 2008, Sofia has won 6 Gold Medals, 5 Silver Medals, and 4 Bronze medals.

Due to disability discrimination and lack of accessibility Sofia moved to the UK for better opportunities — settling in Cardiff, Wales — but her passion for swimming makes her return back to Italy every season to compete.

With a hole in her left lung and a worsening condition she fears that this may be her last competitive year but she is determined to break her own records and to continue going against the current.

We follow her on this potentially final journey while learning her story.

Through archive of Sofia's swimming competitions showcasing her swims from childhood to current day, actuality of her home in Bergamo to her life in the UK, and master interviews with Sofia, her family, and friends we learn her story.

And through interviews with her coach, fellow Italian para-swimmers, and an expert on Disability Discrimination we discuss disability discrimination in Italy.
